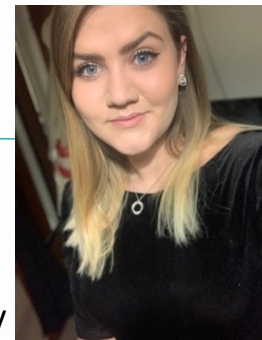


I LOVE MY JOB!
